



Key Final Decision Outcomes

Expenditure

Operating Expenditure

- The final approved operating expenditure by the Commission is \$153.7 million.
- This is \$6.4 million (4.0 per cent) lower than the proposed expenditure of \$160.1 million. This includes GWMWater's actual and forecast expenditure for its rural operations.

Capital Expenditure

- GWMWater proposed capital expenditure of \$87.6 million.
- The Commission's final decision approved capital expenditure of \$92.6 million.
- This is \$5.0 million (5.7 per cent) lower than the proposed expenditure by the water business.

Tariffs

Retail Water Tariffs

- GWMWater proposed to maintain their existing two-part tariffs for residential customers a fixed service charge and a single variable charge.
- In its final decision, the Commission has approved the price structure of residential and non-residential retail water tariffs proposed by GWMWater.

Recycled Water Tariffs

- GWMWater proposed to maintain a two part tariff structure a fixed component and a variable component for residential and non-residential sewerage tariffs.
- The Commission has approved GWMWater's proposal to maintain existing tariff structures for residential and non-residential sewerage services in its final decision.
