FiT rebate at 5.2c '22 only benefits wholesale distribution groups who appear to have the loudest voice. I have only seen my retail electricity bill increase over the past five years. I do shop my retail provider each year to compare to the market.

I have purchased solar to cushion such rises but with such low FiT price this is becoming uneconomic. As the wholesale distributor takes my excess power @ 0.052 and charges my neighbour 0.25 I find your cost calculations very much biased to the wholesalers. I will use technology and increase my existing battery size to move to zero output FiT. Looking forward to the sea swell your pricing is nudging people towards.
