



## Trust in Government Evaporates


# Trust in Government Further Evaporates

- √ 333 submissions responding to the Directions Paper
- ✓ 9 community forums and 9 forums with Mayors and Council CEOs
- Meetings with peak council and ratepayer associations.

# **Implementation Challenges (2017) Participation Spectrum : Collaborate**

- √ 7 technical working groups
- Meetings with council peak organisations, newly elected councillors and ratepayer groups
- ✓ Stakeholders meetings on specific reforms
- ✓ 4 focus groups with citizens on specific reforms.

# Exposure Draft Bill (2017-2018)

"Although LGV has demonstrated better practice in a range of its own activities, it has not sought to address the low levels of community satisfaction with community consultation and engagement initiated by local councils. LGV should take a more active role in promoting processes and resources for better practice public participation."
