Basis for this form

Section 18 of the Electricity Industry Act 2000 (the Industry Act) provides that an application for the issue of a licence must be made to the Commission in a form approved by the commission. This is the form approved by the commission.

Use of this form and the applicant's responsibilities

An application for a licence may be made by any legal person including, without limitation, individuals, partnerships, incorporated associations, unit and other forms of trusts and corporations. Entities that are not a legal person (for example, an unincorporated joint venture) cannot apply for a licence.

For the purpose of this application form, reference to the term "Officer" include the applicant's directors and secretary, and other persons who make or participate in making decisions that affect a substantial part of the business (e.g. Chief Executive Officer, Chief Financial Officer, General Manager etc.).

The applicant should list the information requested in the spaces provided in this form and enclose additional information when required. The applicant must take all reasonable steps to ensure the information provided in the application form is complete, true and correct. An officer of the applicant is required to make a declaration to the effect (in the application form). The applicant is responsible for providing the commission with current, accurate and relevant documentation. It is the applicant's responsibility to make all reasonable inquiries to obtain the information requested by this form.

If insufficient information is provided with an application, we will request additional information to be submitted before the application is considered further.

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The System Integrity Protection Scheme (SIPS) services have been commissioned by AEMO and is a critical project for the network in Victoria.
 VBB is an efficient long-term electricity industry investment for the state of Victoria in that VBB will from 1 November to 31 March every year provide System.

Integrity Protection Scheme (SIPS) thermal service capable of delivering up to 250 MW of active power generation for a period of at least 30 minutes to allow the transfer capacity of the VNI to be increase. The 50 MW not used in the SIPS Services will be used through the NEM wholesale energy market participation. And from 1 April to 31 October every year, 300 MW will be used through the NEM wholesale energy market participation:

⁻ The applicant is a financially viable generator. Long term agreements have been entered into for Asset Management and Operations and Maintenance with experienced long-term industry partners.

⁻ VBB will be subject to all relevant regulatory obligations applying to the Victorian electricity industry and has systems in place to ensure compliance with these requirements.

⁻ The applicant will be subject to the National Electricity Rules which provide consistent regulation across all states in the National Electricity Market. In addition, the Asset Manager is experienced in operating assets across the NEM. The operations will be in compliance with Victorian requirements.
