

What we have heard:

- All retailers signed up (in full or partially) to the voluntary package provided by distribution businesses
- Most uptake is for small business relief for all retailers, and the 20 per cent deferral for small retailers
- Mixed stakeholder views on the package

Support for the future

- With the ongoing support retailers are providing to customers during this time, we are conscious about the financial obligations' retailers have covering ongoing costs while providing customer support
- The AEMC are currently examining what type of support for retailers should be provided in the future
- This proposed rule change will not apply in Victoria
- Stakeholders generally expect more customers will need support in the coming months
