I am writing this submission, because I feel that I am not being given a fair go by my power retailer.

When I first installed Solar panels to my roof one and a half years ago, I did so that my family and I could be more environmental friendly. The thought of selling back excess power generated to the grid to save money and help pay off the price of panels I thought would be great.

When Red energy stated that they would only pay 8c/kWh I was very shocked considering that I was paying over 25c/kWh and that the red energy was making over 17c/kWh profit on the power I was generating, while I understood that the company needs to make a profit I definitely felt I was being cheated. I understand that the power companies own the wires and the poles and there is a cost in upkeep and maintenance, which the cost of the upkeep of the infrastructure is being charges as a daily delivery cost. I also believe that the decentralisation of the structure granted by rooftop solar provides reduces the cost of the infrastructure upkeep saving the power companies money in the long run.

I was shocked 6 months after installing the solar panels that Red energy increased the price I need to pay per kWh while lowering the price they would offset my usage bill to 6 cents per kWh.
